### NORTH SARDINIA COSTA SMERALDA AREA



The little Mortoriotto rocks (part of the La Maddalena National Park) are one of the most appreciated dive site in the area. The Barracuda dive spot is aptly named for a resident school of these inquisitive fish that are almost always roaming the shore side of Mortoriotto. In the clear summer waters, dark stingrays gather here for their seasonal mating season. Tuna, turtles, manta rays have been sighted in these waters, a favorite stop-over for all large migrating fish.

The submerged cliffs reveal a multitude of species and colours allowing you to perform over 30 different dives, around the headland. The presence of many shallow caves is important and peculiar, as they offer environments rich in organisms typical of the dark. In the deep, coralligenous environments offer the most colourful scenerie.







## NORTH SARDINIA SANTA TERESA AREA



Between Sardinia and Corsica, famous for its rich and clear waters, in breathtaking scenery. Large schools of fishes swim quietly in the 3 marine parks waters overlooked by The Straits of Bonifacio. By now, groupers, snappers, Barracuda, Kingfish and enormous stingrays, have lost their justified fear towards humans.








# NORTH SARDINIA LA MADDALENA AREA- SOUTHERN CORSICA



## NORTH SARDINIA LA MADDALENA AREA



On the other side, the Sardinian area is characterized by the beauty of its underwater paths. The shoals of "Spargi", "Mezzogiorno", "Budelli" and "Razzoli" have a highly spectacular morphology, with castles of granite raising up from the sandy ground, in vertical walls of 20-30 meters, covered by the greatest red gorgons of the Mediterranean already at the depth of 15 meters. In this zone there is also a well known and unique dive spot, strictly reserved to the more expert divers: the deep dive at the "Shoal of the Black Coral", (the largest living branch of the Mediterranean Sea).







## NORTH SARDINIA CAPRERA ISLAND AREA



Starting off from Marina Cala Bitta – which is private Marina near to Baja Sardinia – we can reach every dive spots with 15/ 20these minutes. Generally speaking, these dive spots are all sheltered from waves and strong currents. Here all divers of every level can enjoy the dive as we have always good conditions, we can observe many corals, a lot of varies of Gorgonia and a complete range of fish, from the small Anthias to the large Grouper, and from the multicoloured Scorpionfish to the predator schools of Barracuda.
